Local Elections 2018 – Voter ID required

Voters in Knaphill will need to show photographic identification before they can vote in person, at the polling station at the local elections on Thursday 3 May 2018. Voters without any acceptable photographic ID must obtain a Local Elector Card. These changes do not affect anyone voting by post. SOUTH EAST COAST AMBULANCE SERVICE

Our local ambulance service writes of the work they do locally to help our community.

South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (SECamb) is the ambulance service covering Surrey, Sussex and Kent as well as parts of North East Hampshire. It responds to 999 calls from the public, urgent calls from healthcare professionals and provides NHS 111 services across its region.

It was formed on 1 July 2006 following the merger of Kent, Surrey and Sussex ambulance trusts and its one of 10 ambulance services operating in England. The service works across a diverse geographical area of 3,600 square miles with a residential population of



4.5 million which includes densely populated urban areas, sparsely populated rural area and some of the busiest stretches of motorway in the country.

SECamb has over 3,000 staff, of which some 90 percent are operational staff – those caring for patients either face to face, or over the phone at its emergency operations centres in Crawley and Coxheath where we receive 999 calls.

On 22 November 2017, SECamb implemented new national ambulance response standards, known as the 'Ambulance Response Programme'. When a 999 call is received it is prioritized depending on the information provided by the caller. There are four categories of call, the response times for the most serious calls, category 1 is as follows:

Category 1, Response: - For calls with immediately life-threatening and time critical injuries and illnesses. These will be responded to in a mean average time of seven minutes and at least 9 out of 10 times before 15 minutes.

SECamb is a NHS Foundation Trust and as such invites the public to have a say in how it runs its service. It's free to become a member of SECamb, and members will receive a newsletter with potentially life-saving health tips, invitations to ambulance service events, and information about any changes we're planning to our service. Waste Collection Changes

As you are probably aware, back in September 2017, Woking Borough Council switched doorstep refuse collection companies. They are now being emptied by Amey, on behalf of Joint Waste Solutions and meant that for many of us, our bins are collected at slightly different times of the day from how they used to be. The switch over hopes to save the council some money which can be spent elsewhere. Woking is not the only borough in Surrey to have made this change; Elmbridge and Surrey Heath have also done the same, and we believe the rest of the county will gradually follow suit. Changeovers like these often come with a few niggling problems to begin with, but on the whole it's settling down now. However, if you're experiencing problems, then please do contact our local councillors, who would like to hear from you, so that they can sort them out directly.

It's also worth noting that now the food waste (your kitchen caddy stuff) is being collected by a separate truck, which will make the collection more efficient, as the food waste truck doesn't fill up so quickly. The food waste is also being collected by Amey on behalf of Joint Waste Solutions.

A look at some of the influential and well-known women with local connections

As you will no doubt have seen, 2018 marks 100 years since some women were first awarded the vote. This gives us chance to reflect on the strong and influential women who we all have in our lives.

As many people will know, Knaphill has its own special association with "girl power", the spice girls having rehearsed at Woking Youth Arts Centre (then called Trinity Studios) during the 1990s.

More widely, Woking borough has links with many more influential women Delia Smith, celebrity chef and owner of Norwich City Football Club was born in Woking, as was Countdown's resident vocabulary expert Susie Dent.

Woking had strong links to the suffragette movement which

obtained the vote for women all those years ago, Dame Ethel Smyth was a long time Woking resident who took a leading role in movement as well as being a successful composer (she was the first female composer to be awarded a damehood). The local musical connection also extended to composer and pianist Adelina de Lara who was a long time resident of the borough.

Woking's links to influential women dates back centuries, Lady Margaret Beaufort the mother of King Henry VII lived in Woking for several years.

This should give us pause to consider how we can encourage girls and women locally to have the confidence to go out and pursue their goals. Who knows, over the coming years we may have many more to add to our list of influential local females.

Aherne. She graduated from Royal Holloway University and since then has forged a vibrant musical career in Surrey and the South East as a pianist, accompanist, teacher and founder of the "Black Cat" opera group.


