COUNCILLOR'S CORNER: An update from County and Borough Councillor Saj Hussain



PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Surrey County Council is seeking your views on the public services affecting us all. A consultation has been launched for input as the County Council seeks to make £200 million worth of saving over the next few years.

Since 2010, over £500 million has already been saved from the County Council's budget but a further reduction in central government funding means the council needs to again look at ways we can increase efficiency in the services provided locally.

The consultation is focused around children's centre, community recycling centres, libraries, special educational needs and disabled/concessionary travel funding. I'm sure you will agree that these are all vital services and I would urge everyone to take part in the survey online at www.surreycc.gov.uk/council-and-democracy/have-your-say/consultation. As your local representatives, borough councillors Melanie Whitehand, Debbie Harlow and myself will be working with council officers to ensure that the council continues to provide good local services.

HIGHWAYS

The council's highways team are currently working to remove the bollards by the Vyne Centre by early next year. This will allow traffic using the Vyne to move more freely.

PLANNING UPDATE

A couple of recent planning updates are that the old ambulance station site on Bagshot Road will be redeveloped to provide social housing and also that the Robin Hood pub sadly closed its doors and a planning application is imminent for this site to house the community transport buses in addition to some affordable housing.

Finally, as this is the last issue before Christmas, I'd like to take this opportunity to wish everyone season's greetings and best wishes for the new year from your Knaphill councillors. Also, a quick reminder that councillors' surgery is held on the last Saturday of each month at Knaphill Library from 10:00 to 11:00. No appointment necessary.

A GOLDEN YEAR FOR KASJOG



Knaphill and St Johns Operatic Group is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year! It was started in 1968 by Margaret Hennessey-Brown, then Director of Music at The Winston Churchill School. Our home from that time until 1993 was the school until we became a registered charity and moved our productions to The Rhoda McGaw Theatre where we have performed ever since.

The group has gone from strength to strength, over the years putting on not only an annual operetta (we later incorporated light opera into our already well-established repertoire of Gilbert and Sullivan), but also a variety of other performances including anniversary revues, Verdi's Requiem, Vivaldi's Gloria, Gilbert and Sullivan for All supporting ex-D'Oyly Carte principals, shows at the (long gone) QE2 School, Old

Tyme Music Halls and many other concert performances in various locations right up to our most recent one with The Egham Band!

Our first ever production was Trial by Jury and we thought it fitting to reprise that show as part of our 2018 anniversary celebrations, combining it with another of our favourites, HMS Pinafore.

In March 2019 we return to Franz Lehar's sparkling comedy, The Merry Widow, which we last performed in 2005. The shenanigans at the embassy in Paris of the fictional principality of Pontevedro form the basis of this light-hearted operetta, in which the ambassador is trying to marry off the wealthy widow, Anna Glavari, to a Pontevdrian citizen in order to save the country from bankruptcy. The show features some well-known favourites such as Vilia, You'll Find Me at Maxim's and The Merry Widow Waltz.







A retired Knaphill couple were featured in the November issue of Garden Answers magazine, having won the national title of Best Gardener's Garden in the magazine's Cobra Garden competition 2018. Pamela and Barry Gray have been cultivating their garden for 30 years, and view it not only as a hobby but as a source of wellbeing. It has also brought a lot of pleasure to passers-by and people who have visited it over the years when it was open to the public as part of the National Garden Scheme.

On a more local level, Pam and Barry also took second place to Lin and Dave Cottrell in the Best Large Front Garden section of Woking



in Bloom. Knaphill residents also featured prominently in many of the other sections, either individually or as part of the Knaphill Allotment Association, namely: Best small front garden, best tub or container, best floral public house, best wildlife garden, best kept allotment site, best cultivated plot, best cultivated plot by a lady, best newly cultivated plot and best cultivated plot by someone over 70 years old, where the Knaphill Allotment Association took the first three places.

Sainsbury's UPDATE

As we reported on in our last newsletter, Sainsbury's is planning to replace the existing Homebase building at Redding Way with three new retail units. Sainsbury's ran a consultation over the summer and autumn and have since told us that the response to the consultation from those who took part was broadly positive. Following this they have submitted a planning application to Woking Borough Council for consent to the plans. Feedback from the public consultation has

formed a part of this application. Those interested in viewing the details of the application can do so by visiting the planning portal on Woking Borough Council's website. The planning reference is PLAN/2018/0973.

There is still no clear picture on the type of retailers who will take up the three units but we look forward to getting further details on this and will keep residents updated on the progress of this application.

Knaphill Methodist Church Clothing Bank

On 20 October 'Knaphill Methodist Church Clothing Bank' celebrated its 1st anniversary and we would like to say a huge THANK YOU to all those people who help and support us.

We started collecting clothing and bed linen but soon realised we didn't have enough space for the bed linen. So, we took that to the local homeless shelter, who were very grateful to receive it.

We contacted a few SureStart Centres asking them to put up posters and tell those less-fortunate about our service. It was a very slow start however. We had just one family the first time we opened and no-one the second month, so we then contacted around 25 venues in the area who were all willing to put up our posters and give out our vouchers and flyers. Now we regularly see five to seven families each month from very different backgrounds.

Thankfully we're still receiving donations and never say no to more. Please contact clothing@knaphill-Methodist-church.com if you have items for us. We'll be very pleased to receive them. Also, do let us know if you're able to help us contact people who need our help. We have two rooms; children's' clothes in one and adult's in the other. Our volunteers help guests, who come along between 2pm-4pm on the third Saturday of each month. We offer tea, coffee, cakes and pastoral care. Children can play games, decorate cakes or do some drawings. There's a wonderful relaxed atmosphere.

We often have the same families returning each month. They bring their friends along and clothing that their children have outgrown is brought back. We have quite a few Syrian families; thankfully we also have Google Translate!

We have also sent five black sacks of teenage clothes to the Syrian refugees in Guildford, three black sacks of baby clothes went to The Gambia and we support The Whitechapel Mission in London too.

Did you ever have to provide a costume for your children to take part in a school nativity play? We had to find a shepherd's outfit one year. Eventually giving up on repurposing tea towels for headgear - which first century shepherd would have had an advert for PG Tips on his head? - we did what so many parents did in these circumstances. We bought a costume at Woolworth's (remember them?) and later sold it on eBay.

If you've been through an exercise like that, you might have the typical cuddly image of a shepherd in the stories of Jesus' birth. Or you might think of the 'One man and his dog' TV image of a man with a weather-beaten face whistling orders to a dog who rounds up sheep on the Yorkshire Moors.

But these cuddly images were far from how people perceived shepherds in the time of Jesus. They were glad the shepherds were out in the fields, outside the towns, because they were thought of as petty criminals and undesirables. Think of the way we view burglars or what people say when travellers move into a village and you won't be far off the popular sentiment of two thousand years ago.

In other words, the shepherds were at the very least social outsiders.

And they weren't the only ones in the biblical story. The wise men were, too. For one thing, they weren't Jews, part of the 'chosen people'. For another, they were astrologers, a trade lampooned in the Bible for being anything but a wise way to live. Wise men? Not really. Outsiders again.

But the outsiders are drawn to the birth of Jesus, the Saviour of the world. And maybe the same could be true today. You may feel an outsider to the church, Christianity, and Jesus. After all, Christian faith is a minority practice now in our society. I have known people feel nervous about entering a church building.

But Jesus is for outsiders! He welcomes such people. He seemed to have more time for outsiders than for religious professionals like me! If you've ever been curious or fascinated by Jesus, why not try out one of the Christmas services in Knaphill this year. Details are on the back page.

Like the angel said to the shepherds in the story, 'Don't be afraid. I bring you news of great joy.'
