

Interview with the new Mayor of Woking, Cllr Saj Hussain



Many people in Knaphill and neighbouring villages connect Sai Hussain with Knaphill's post office, where he has been sub-postmaster since 1986. Saj has also been involved with the Knaphill Residents' Association, which he chaired in 2006-2007. Saj loves helping people and in 2012 became a councillor for Knaphill. The following year he was elected as Surrey County councillor for Knaphill and Goldsworth West.

Saj vividly remembers arriving in Woking from Pakistan at the age of 11. He didn't speak any

English but met some lovely neighbours who helped with this.

Saj is married with four grown-up children and is blessed with nine grandchildren.

Saj is the 48th Mayor of Woking and holds the record for being the longest serving deputy mayor of Woking: three consecutive terms. I asked Saj what his hobbies are, to which he responded: helping people. The main reason he went into politics is to make Knaphill a vibrant, safe and prosperous village. Saj is very appreciative of the four churches in Knaphill, the Knaphill Residents' Association, Knaphill Care and numerous other volunteer groups who are giving their time to help other, less fortunate people.

His chosen charity for this year is LinkAble (www.linkable.org.uk), a Woking charity organizing activities for children and adults with learning disabilities, thus providing respite care for parents and carers. The KRA wishes Saj a fruitful and enjoyable time as Mayor of Woking.

Project for new eco-friendly canal boat on The Basingstoke Canal



The Basingstoke Canal Society has been promoting and campaigning for the sustainable future of the 32mile Canal as a navigation and public amenity since 1966. Through the John Pinkerton Canal Cruises operation, it raises money to fund the maintenance and improvement works undertaken by more than 250 volunteers. The volunteers also support the works undertaken by the owners - Surrey and Hampshire County Councils.

The Society operates two boats providing trips and this is our main source of income. Kitty (named after the last horse to tow barges on the canal) operates from The Town Wharf in Woking, and John Pinkerton II operates from Odiham.

However, a canal boat can only go on for so long before repairs become almost impossible to sustain. Kitty is nearing the end of her life and we plan to replace her with an all-electric boat. As well as making the new Kitty non-polluting and all-electric, we also plan to install several charging points on the canal in Woking which will represent the first step towards making the canal fully electric for all users. The new Kitty will also be much better adapted for the less abled, being designed from scratch to allow easier wheelchair access and provide enough space for an on-board toilet.

Sadly, canal boats don't come cheap! The boat will be produced by a UK-based boatbuilder and together with installing the charging network, we need to raise over £200,000 to replace Kitty. To prime this, the Basingstoke Canal Society is contributing £70,000 from its own funds and we are aiming to raise the remaining £130,000 from a variety of sources including grants, individual and corporate donations.



In November 2021, we launched a Crowdfunding campaign to raise part of the £200,000 needed to replace Kitty and this first stage of our fundraising project has finished with a great success! Our target was £20k and with your generosity we successfully raised £12,447 (+ est. £2180.50 Gift Aid) with 196 supporters in 42 days.

The Knaphill Village Show returns this year on


Saturday 16th July

A short history of Mizens Railway

Mizens Railway started life in 1988 on the actual Mizens Farm, just off the A322 between Woking and the Otter Roundabout - the site now occupied by the McLaren Factory - following a meeting of 25 likeminded people interested in starting a miniature railway.

The owners of Mizens Farm very generously allowed them the use of a barn for secure storage of locomotives and rolling stock, and also paid for the purchase of the 7 1/4" gauge running track. Building works commenced in 1989, with the formal opening in May 1990. The public were invited to ride the trains on the first and third Sundays between May and September, and at special firework and Santa events later in the year. Membership steadily increased and the railway became a huge local success.

In 1998 the farm was purchased by McLaren, and in 1999 the Society's lease for the land ran out. Fortunately, a condition of the sale was that an alternative site be provided for the railway by the purchasers. With support from Woking Council, planning permission was given for the development of a ten-acre site of a former nursery on Barrs Lane in Knaphill.

Work started in earnest in autumn 2000, and through one of the wettest winters on record, the club house was built, a railway layout was completed, and the extensive car park laid out. Trains recommenced running in 2001, and around this time Mizens Railway Society was joined by the Brooklands Model Railway Group who moved onto the site. By 2002 membership had grown to 100, allowing completion of the inner and outer track circuits.

A full-size coach was donated to the Railway in April 2006, with members raising over £3,000 to have it delivered to its present location at Mizens. This was followed in 2012 by the acquisition by the North British Locomotive Group of a full sized South African Railways locomotive no 196, currently positioned near the entrance to the car park.

Mizens Railway welcomes people with an interest in railways or railway modeling, as well as volunteers to help us run and maintain this comprehensive undertaking. It calls itself: Geek Retreat and was opened on January 22, 2022. I say 'business', but after having spoken to the owner Al, I conclude that it's not about commerce, but about community.

Al worked in the music industry, but that came to a standstill through Covid. He is now the enthusiastic owner of the place where people of all ages can play games like tcg (trading card games), comics, Dungeons and Dragons, Warhammer. I must confess I only thought this was something for young people, but Al assures me people of all ages come in, have a nice drink (I tried their cappuccino, which was great!) and have a good time together. Apart from the typical 'Geek games', board games like Scrabble are provided and there is even a knitting group!

Does Al not think Geek Retreat distracts young people from doing their homework? Not really, says Al, because on Thursday and Friday morning it turns into a quiet place to do coursework and to study. There is also a room for free for a smaller party.

Geek Retreat is open all year round, except for Christmas day, from 10 am to 10 pm.

Greek Retreat are Vegan Friendly and welcome anyone and everyone from all backgrounds and ages. They run events daily (usually £5 entry with a free item including booster packs, exclusive items or drinks), or you can pop in, grab a coffee and enjoy their free-to-play board games, comics and atmosphere!

When Knaphill author Mal Foster completed his first book, *The Asylum Soul*, he thought the publication of his acclaimed historical novel would be a once in a lifetime experience. "I was really happy with just that," he says. Seven years later, he has just released his fifth title, *Fluke's Cradle*, which tells the story of a local man who wakes up from a coma, believing he is the person he was in a previous life.

Eddie Noble had always wondered who his father was. His mother had died shortly after childbirth, and those shielding him from life's future challenges were not always forthcoming with any answers.

Following a mysterious medical episode whilst searching for his mother's grave, Eddie becomes increasingly convinced he is the person he was in a previous life. He then undergoes an enforced period of regression therapy to aid his rehabilitation.


Enter Marianne Borg, a beautiful psychic medium, Nathaniel Bream, a quirky psychiatric paranormal research specialist, and Professor Allan, a mental health scientist who all take a particular interest in Eddie's plight.

Only published in April by *Publish Nation*, Fluke's Cradle has already received numerous five-star reviews and has been labelled Mal's best writing yet.

Mal also hosts the *Woking Writes* book blog which helps promote the work of other local writers as well as running low key 'Writing as Therapy' sessions in the area for people with mental health issues.

Kate Kett, the owner, tells me with enthusiasm about her desire for an eco-friendlier world. She has always been interested in environmental issues and she wanted a local shop to sell eco-friendly products. She sells products made by local people, such as facemasks and gift bags, but her main business is selling a wide range of eco-friendly cleaning products, washing-up liquid and anything you can think of, as well as coffee, pasta, muesli and other foodstuffs, organic where possible.

You come with your empty bottles and Tupperware, and she refills them. By profession she is a pharmacist, so her shop is only open on Thursdays from 9 am till 3 pm, but people can always leave a bag with empty containers at the doorstep with a shopping list inside, and then come back later to pick it up.

Memorial Service Brookwood

I became aware of the mass graves at Brookwood Cemetery and the link to Brookwood Hospital over five years ago. The cemetery and the hospital, which opened in 1854 and in 1867 respectively, have always had links until the hospital finally closed in 1994, and Brookwood Cemetery is the final resting place of over 1300 patients from Brookwood Hospital, Botleys Park Hospital and other asylums and workhouses of the time.

There are a couple of plots in the Cemetery, and for the one we originally identified I worked with Woking Borough Council officer Ian Tomes, who helped organise the plinth, identifying this space for these poor souls who were overlooked in life and forgotten in death.

No relatives generally came forward to give a burial to the people whose lives ended in such places. The stigma of being placed in a mental institution/lunatic asylum – to use some of the many derogatory words that described the hospitals – meant that the patients who entered there were abandoned by their families, possibly never seeing them again.


